

New York is the place to be at this time of year, as Christmas descends on the city in spectacular style. Hit the Ice - hopefully not literally - at the Central Park rink

few days for the Duke and Duchess Of
Cambridge as they embarked on
their first official trip to New York together
over the weekend.

During their whistle-stop tour, the couple paid their respects at the 9/11 memorial and watched an NBA basketball game, before heading to a charity gala in aid of St Andrews University — where they met — at Manhattan's Metropolitan Museum Of Art on Tuesday, their last night in the Big Apple.

The city that never sleeps is certainly the place to be in the run up to Christmas, with festive shop windows, outdoor skating rinks and usually a dusting of snow. OK!'s Annabel Zammit set off to explore as many corners of the city as possible, hailing herself a yellow cab and spotting a few A-listers along the way...

WHICH STARS MIGHT I SEE?

OK! visited New York during Fashion Week, with Rihanna, Lady Gaga and Sarah Jessica Parker all putting in an appearance on the front row.



Victoria Beckham also presented her SSI5 collection when *OK*! was in town, and we spied David and Brooklyn sitting next to Anna Wintour in the best seats in the house. Whatever time of year you visit, the Big Apple is always a celebrity magnet, with Beyoncé and Jay Z, Leonardo DiCaprio and Kim Kardashian and Kanye West all owning homes in the city.

WHERE CAN I STAY?

With dual aspect views across the city, our corner room at The Quin in Midtown Manhattan was hard to beat. While the royals are thought to have stayed a couple of blocks away at the Art Deco Carlyle Hotel on Madison Avenue, OK! loved our hip, contemporary hotel, just a five-minute walk from 5th Avenue and Central Park. The 208-room Quin boasts an impressive art collection, marble floors, plush furnishings and state-of-the-art technology. Dinner at the hotel's Wayfarer restaurant - an Art Deco-inspired delight - is a must. It's a classic US grill, with the most irresistible surf and turf. You might even see Taylor Swift - we're told she's a fan.

While in town, we also stayed at The Kitano in Murray Hill, a member of Preferred Hotel Group. This boutique hotel offers nightly jazz performances in the bar – the perfect way to round off a day

– as is dinner at Hakubai, the
hotel's authentic Japanese
restaurant.

WHERE CAN I EAT AND DRINK?

Have you ever been served bubbly while you wait in a queue for the loo? We hadn't either, but loved the touch at Beauty & Essex - a chandelier-lit restaurant hidden behind a curtain in a pawnshop in the Lower East Side. The champagne brunch is not to be missed. Tao Downtown in Chelsea is a must-visit. Not only does this Asian-fusion eatery serve some of the best Chinese food we've ever tasted (the Chilean sea bass satav is noteworthy), you're sure to bump into a celeb as Katie Holmes, Cameron Diaz, Naomi Campbell and Gerard Butler are all fans.

Nowhere does prohibition glamour like the Big Apple, so leave time to listen to jazz in a speakeasy-style bar. We loved Bathtub Gin, which you enter via a trick door inside the Stone Street Coffee Company. The bar centres around a copper bath and serves the best gin cocktails we've ever had. Head to the Music Hall Of Williamsburg for a gig to remember and, if nightclubs are your thing, a night at Lavo - an Italian restaurant, club and lounge - is the place to be.

WHERE CAN I SHOP?

Macy's, Bloomingdale's and Barneys are well worth a look, but OK! also went in search of some more affordable, hidden gems. We picked up a '60s prom dress at the Brooklyn Flea, a market with more than 100 stalls, that runs every weekend of the year, selling clothes, jewellery and crafts by local designers. Head to Williamsburg for a scout around the independent record, book and clothes shops, or if you've been saving for a festive dress, then Haute Hippie in SoHo is the place to head - think sequins and embellished embroidery. For High Street stores head to Broadway and for designer labels, hit the

Meatpacking District. We also went to Lululemon in downtown Manhattan for yoga gear and picked up a couple of pairs of shoes in cheekily named Shoegasm,

If you're looking for a one-off gifts, venture to one of the festive markets that dot the city at this time of year. Popular markets include the Union Square Holiday Market and the Winter Village at

Bryant Park, where there's also an ice rink. Our favourite, however, was the Holiday Fair inside

Grand Central Station.

WHAT ELSE CAN I DO?

Check out the city that never sleeps from on high at Top Of The Rock - the observation deck at the top of the Rockefeller Center with great







views across to the city. If that gives you a taste for the high life, take a walk along the High Line, an elevated former railway line that starts at Gansevoort in the Meatpacking District and runs to West 34th Street. Or take to the water on a cruise around the Statue Of Liberty.

For something different, take a ferry from Manhattan to the Brooklyn neighbourhood of DUMBO (Down Under the Manhattan Bridge Overpass). This once-industrial district is now super-trendy and has great views of Manhattan.

A visit to the Boathouse in Central Park, where

the Made In Chelsea cast shot scenes for their New York spin-off, is memorable and filling - the steak and eggs are delicious! Burn off the calories with a stroll around the park or take a spin on the rink on the park's east side.

And no trip to New York is complete without going to a game

- be it basketball like royalty or baseball like OK!. We supported the locals and went to a Mets game at Citi Field in Queens, eating hotdogs while frustrated fans watched as they lost - again!

HOW DO I GET THERE?
